About Michigan-genotype native plants

"Michigan native plants" are here defined as species that occurred prior to European settlement. The Floristic Quality Assessment, developed in 2001 by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Natural Heritage Program, was used to determine whether a species is native to Michigan.

Michigan-genotype native plants are genetically adapted to the particular climate and soils in which they have evolved. These plants exhibit excellent survivability and the potential to naturalize readily from seed when planted in appropriate habitats.

A note about scientific names

Although the two-part scientific names of species are generally thought to be universal and constant, they can, in fact, be changed. As new technologies such as DNA sequencing become more widely used, researchers discover new relationships among groups of plants, and the taxonomy of those groups is updated accordingly.

Significant changes in taxonomy and scientific names occurred in 2006. Please be aware that many of the names with which you are familiar, or which might be used in older field guides and references, are no longer correct. For this source guide, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Plants Database was used as a reference for current plant taxonomy and scientific names.

To ease the transition to the new names, this guide contains entries for both new and old names. The listing for a new name includes the old name in parentheses, and the listing for an old name contains a pointer to the new one.
