#### b. Introduction of ARC guests

Brandy Siedlaczek, Chair, asked all guests in attendance to introduce themselves.

#### c. Additions or Changes to the Draft Meeting Agenda

There were no additions or changes to the draft agenda.

#### d. Approval of November 18, 2015 Meeting Summary

The motion was made by Kathryn Hagaman, Bingham Farms, to approve the November 18, 2015 meeting summary. It was seconded by Bob Belair, Canton, and passed unanimously.

#### 2. Resolution: FOTR/ARC Merger Investigation

Bob Belair, Canton, reviewed the resolution that is being presented to the Full ARC. He reviewed the information that has been presented to the members over the last several meetings. Kathryn Hagaman, Bingham Farms, asked what the response was from the private funders of FOTR. Jim Ridgway responded, stating that the private funders were supportive of the merger. Jim also explained that the communities can expect the same services in support of the MS4 permits.

The resolution in support of the new non-profit entity was read. The motion was made by Kathryn Hagaman, Bingham Farms, for ARC staff to proceed with preparing the documents and support information to consummate the merger of the ARC and the FOTR into a single, new non-profit entity that will continue the activities of both entities. The motion was seconded by Jacy Garrison, Oakland County. The ayes were: Bingham Farms, Birmingham, Bloomfield Twp., Bloomfield Hills, Canton Twp., Farmington, Farmington Hills, Henry Ford College, Livonia, Melvindale, Novi, Oakland County, Orchard Lake, Plymouth Twp., Redford Twp., Rochester Hills, Romulus, Troy, Walled Lake, Washtenaw County (via email), Wayne, Wayne County, Westland and Wixom. There was no nayes. Absent were: Auburn Hills, Beverly Hills, Commerce Twp., Dearborn Heights, Franklin, Garden City, Inkster, Lathrup Village, Northville, Northville Twp., Plymouth, University of Michigan-Dearborn, Van Buren Twp., Wayne County Airport Authority. Southfield abstained because of conflict of interest being that Brandy Siedlaczek is a FOTR board member.

#### 3. Executive Director Report

#### a. Grant Status Report

John O'Meara, ARC Staff, gave the grant project status report.

#### **ONGOING GRANTS:**

#### 2015 Rouge River Public Advisory Council (RRAC) Support

The ARC submitted an application to the Great Lakes Commission to continue facilitation of the RRAC. Development of the final Rouge Habitat List through the Habitat Subcommittee meetings has been completed. The full RRAC at it membership meeting on February 22, 2016 approved the list as final for submittal to MDEQ.

#### **FOTR-ARC Merger Investigation**

FOTR and the ARC were awarded a grant from the Erb Family Foundation in the amount of \$110,000 to explore merging the organizations. The Reorganization Investigation Committee (RIC) has developed a recommendation that included merging the two organizations. The FOTR Board has approved this recommendation and it will go to their membership for approval in April 2016 pending ARC Board approval in March. There is a draft schedule and scope of the transition process that has been prepared by the RIC.

#### Collaborative Invasive Species Control in Rouge and Detroit River AOC

The ARC has been attending the work group meetings and working on handouts for some of the trainings. Noel Mullett reported that they have started the bid process with their next meeting scheduled for April and work beginning in August with efforts at Newburgh Lake, phragmites control in Rouge and Detroit AOCs, activities occurring during Rouge Rescue by FOTR and work days and presentations with Friends of Detroit River.

#### **US Forestry Service 2014 Tree Grant**

All communities have executed the IAA with the ARC. Approximately 75% of the communities have had their proposed trees approved. One community has planted their trees and asked for their initial 50% reimbursement. ARC needs communities to make sure they are securing, planting, locating their trees this spring and providing their project summaries by June 2016. The ARC will finalize the grant reporting this summer for grant closure in August 2016.

#### SAW Grant: Monitoring and Stormwater Management Planning

The ARC received the SAW funding grant agreement last week and returned for execution November 10, 2015. The grant covers development of member MS4 permit applications, monitoring, and stormwater funding planning efforts. ARC staff are on track to meet to April 1 permit deadline. Communities have received their draft applications for review. The collaborative PEP, IDEP, PPP and TMDL plans have either gone or will be going out to the full membership for comment.

NOAA GLRI Habitat Restoration: Henry Ford Estate Dam Fish Passage (Design)

ARC has held monthly Project Partners (NOAA, ARC, Wayne County, RRAC, MDEQ,
USACE, National Park Service, and Henry Ford Estate) calls to update and receive
feedback. Geotechnical field analysis, wetland delineation, topographic surveys, and T8

feedback. Geotechnical field analysis, wetland delineation, topographic surveys, and T&E database work has been completed. Review of the Corp model has been concluded. Based on this review restructuring of the model was needed and developed.

#### **PENDING GRANT APPLICATIONS:**

#### **NOAA Regional Partnership**

The ARC joined a partnership with Friends of Detroit River (FDR) and the Friends of the Rouge (FOTR) to submit a NOAA Regional partnership grant in February 2016. FDR is listed as the fiduciary with the ARC as a major supporting member. The grant is for conducting listed habitat projects within the two AOCs over the next three years. It is anticipated that knowledge of award with occur in May/June 2016, with award in September 2016.

John O'Meara also stated that the next round of PAC support grants would be out within the next few weeks and the ARC will be applying for continued support of the Rouge River Advisory Council.

#### b. Call for Projects

John O'Meara asked if any members have projects in mind that ARC Staff can begin to research funding mechanisms.

#### 4. Treasurers/Finance Committee Report (Bob Belair, Treasurer)

#### a. 2015 Membership Dues

Bob Belair reported that all 2015 dues have been received.

#### b. A/R and A/P Reports

Bob Belair reviewed the accounts receivable and accounts payables reports.

#### 5. Standing Committee Reports

a. Organization Committee (Kelly Cave, Chair)

Chris O'Meara, ARC Staff, reported on behalf of Kelly Cave that the Organization Committee has nothing to report.

#### b. PIE Committee

Charles Markus, PIE Committee Chair, reported that the PIE committee is planning to host or coordinate with FOTR on various workshops including septic systems, turf maintenance, native plantings and pollinator gardens. She also informed the Full ARC that billboards will be shown in the watershed with tips for FOG, Rouge Rescue, pet waste, and fertilizer in 2016. The planned seasonal posters are being drafted and will be distributed in May or early June starting with the spring and summer posters.

#### c. Technical Committee

Karen Mondora, Farmington Hills, reported the ARC Staff continue to work with the Technical Committee on the collaborative IDEP and TMDL plans. The committee is also working on the county work plans for their 2016 IDEP activities. The next Technical Committee meeting is also being scheduled.

#### 6. Report from Cooperating Partners

#### Cranbrook Institute of Science

Michele Arquette-Palermo offered their facilities to host upcoming ARC events.

#### Friends of the Rouge

Sally Petrella reported that the GLRI invasive species activities continue. She reported that the Spring Bug Hunt was a success along with the Winter Stonefly Search. Frog and Toad surveys have begun. She reviewed the AOC conference that was held in Dearborn. She reminded the Full ARC that the 30<sup>th</sup> annual Rouge Rescue is scheduled for May 21, 2016. Lastly Sally informed the Full ARC that Aimee LaLonde-Norman has resigned as FOTR Executive Director and that they are currently looking for her replacement.

#### Rouge River Advisory Council

Bill Craig stated that RRAC and the Habitat Subcommittee have finalized the Rouge River list of projects to remove the habitat BUIs and have submitted it to the MDEQ and EPA.

#### 7. Report from Counties

Noel Mullett, Wayne County, informed the Full ARC that they will be hosting a HHW event on April 23, 2016.

Jacy Garrison, Oakland County, reported that they continue to update their stormwater standards and hope to have them available by June. They also anticipate meeting with Wayne County and MDEQ for review and feedback. They will then receive comment from developers and contractors. Any questions should be forwarded to Jim Wineka.

Jacy also stated that they will be hosting this year's IDEP training and anticipate it being held in Waterford in October with seating for around 85 participants.

#### 8. Report from MDEQ

Andrew Bahrou, MDEQ, reminded the ARC members that progress reports are due March 31 and there are no extensions. He asked the members let him know if you will not be in on time so he knows. He encouraged all communities preparing MS4

applications for the April 1 deadline to prepare their certifier agreements and get them in to MDEQ. He encouraged any member contact him if they have any questions.

Andrew Bahrou stated that SEMCOG is coordinating an industrial stormwater recertification.

Andrew reported that he visited some project sites that were funded with 319 dollars including FOTR rain gardens in Johnson and Tonquish Creek at municipal, residential and school sites. He reminded members that the next round of 319 project ideas are due in July.

#### 9. Opportunity for Public Comment

There were no public comments.

#### NOAA GLRI Habitat Restoration: Henry Ford Estate Dam Fishway (Design)

50% design plans are being completed. Plans will be shared with project partners at a mid-July meeting. T&E, wetland, soil characterization and other field investigations have been completed this spring for permit and design considerations.

#### 2016 Rouge River Advisory Council (RRAC) Support

This grant was awarded June 23, 2016, and will fund activities to continue general business activities of the RRAC, finalize the list of habitat project descriptions, and conduct fish sampling in the Rouge River Area of Concern (AOC). The grant is \$29,945 with work ending in June 2017.

#### PENDING GRANT APPLICATIONS

#### **NOAA** Regional Partnership

The ARC joined a partnership with Friends of Detroit River (FDR) and the Friends of the Rouge (FOTR) to submit a NOAA Regional partnership grant in February 2016. FDR is listed as the fiduciary with the ARC as the supporting member for the Rouge AOC activities. The grant is for conducting listed habitat projects within the two AOCs. NOAA has asked for some updates to the application be made by the end of June 2016 with the anticipation of announcing award of the partnership to FDR in July. Initial work on potential Rouge projects would not begin until 2017.

#### **USFS Green Infrastructure Implementation**

The ARC has applied for a grant from the Forest Service to conduct maintenance and enhancement for green infrastructure sites within member communities. The grant will be for \$150,000. Current ARC communities interested in participating include Livonia, Canton Twp., Village of Franklin, Farmington Hills, Walled Lake, Southfield and Wayne County.

#### **Rouge River AOC Wayne County Habitat Restoration**

EPA is going to "direct fund" the following three Rouge River AOC projects in one grant to Wayne County, with the ARC as a partner in the grant. The potential grant award could be \$6.5 million. Contracting details are currently being negotiated with the EPA with anticipated funding arriving later fall 2016. The grant is anticipated to be completed in late 2019.

- Henry Ford Estate Fishway (Construction) This grant activity will construct the fishway that is currently
  be completed by the ARC under the NOAA grant. This activity will reconnect approximately 50 miles of
  main river and 108 tributary miles to the Great Lakes. This project supports the removal of the Habitat
  Beneficial Use Impairments for the Rouge River.
- Oxbow Phase III (Construction) -This grant activity will construct the previous ARC designed Oxbow
  Phase 3 Restoration that was completed under a grant from NOAA. This will involve removal of a
  portion of the concrete channel, restoration with native vegetation and habitat structures and
  construction of a bridge. This project supports the removal of the Habitat Beneficial Use Impairments
  for the Rouge River.
- Nankin Lake Restoration (Design/Construction)- Nankin Lake Restoration will restore the ecosystem services the lake provides; valuable spawning, nursery, and forage habitat for fishes and other aquatic species of all life stages.

**COMMITTEE MAKING REQUEST:** Finance Committee

**BACKGROUND:** The Alliance of Rouge Communities (ARC) has received a \$29,945.00 grant from the MDEQ Office of the Great Lakes, AOC Program, 2016 Public Advisory Council (PAC) to facilitate the "Rouge River AOC PAC Support – Facilitation, Habitat & Fish" project. The ARC was notified of the awarded funding in May, 2016, with activities beginning upon the finalization of a grant agreement.

**DESCRIPTION OF ANTICIPATED ACTIVITIES**: The Rouge RAP Advisory Council (RRAC) and the Alliance of Rouge Communities (ARC) applied for this grant to fund activities to continue to rebuild RRAC and facilitate RRAC meetings and general business activities in the Rouge River Area of Concern (AOC). Many of the previously completed reports listed project types, in addition to specific projects, that needed to be completed in the watershed. The EPA, MDEQ, MDNR and RRAC, ARC staff began facilitating the development of the list for removal of the Habitat BUIs. This work resulted in the development of a final Rouge AOC Habitat list that was submitted to MDEQ in March 2016. This current request will provide RRAC support for development of more in depth descriptions of the Habitat Restoration List projects.

In addition, Fish surveying by FOTR to date has included an update on the current status of the endangered redside dace (Clinostomus elongatus), the identification of several new species and provides the most current information on the Rouge fish community. Many areas have relatively healthy fish populations and could be delisted. This work plan would continue the work to characterize the Rouge fish community.

**RATIONALE:** The 2016 budget must be adjusted to reflect this additional funding.

**BUDGET:** The total budget is \$29,945 and broken down as \$16,373 – ARC staff, \$10,002 – FOTR and \$3,570 – Wayne County. This amendment adds the SPAC8 grant budget line to the 2016 ARC Budget with funding estimated for 2016 activities in the amount of \$14,970. No match is required. The remainder of the grant funds (\$14,975) will be booked in the 2017 budget.

**PERSON/AGENCY RESPONSIBLE FOR IMPLEMENTATION:** Work will be completed by the ARC Executive Director Staff, Friends of the Rouge and Wayne County.

The total compensation for this scope of services is \$16,373.00 (of which \$8,186.50 is anticipated to be spent during the 2016 budget year). The ARC will be reimbursed by the MDEQ Office of the Great Lakes for 100% of this cost.

#### **Project**

The Alliance of Rouge Communities (ARC) has received a \$29,945 grant from the Great Lakes Commission to facilitate the Rouge River Advisory Council. The ARC was awarded the funding in June, 2016, with activities beginning upon grant agreement finalization and ending on June 30, 2017.

#### **Project Tasks**

Many of the previously completed reports [Ex: Habitat Delisting Targets (2008), Rouge River Delisting Strategy (2012), Upper Rouge Delisting Strategy (2012), and Rouge River BUI Report Card (2013)] listed project types, in addition to specific projects, that needed to be completed in the watershed. The EPA, MDEQ, MDNR and RRAC, ARC staff began facilitating the development of the list for removal of the Habitat BUIs. This work resulted in the development of a final Rouge AOC Habitat list that was submitted to MDEQ in March 2016. This current request will provide RRAC support for development of more in depth description of Habitat Restoration List projects.

Fish surveying by FOTR to date has included an update on the current status of the endangered redside dace (*Clinostomus elongatus*), the identification of several new species and provides the most current information on the Rouge fish community. Many areas have relatively healthy fish populations and could be delisted. This work plan would continue the work to characterize the Rouge fish community.

#### Task 1 – RRAC Business Facilitation

- ARC staff will facilitate and support the activities of the RRAC. This will include the
  planning and facilitation of three regular RRAC meetings, preparation and distribution
  meeting agendas and summaries, and other activities needed for the RRAC to fulfill its
  mission as a public advisory group.
- ARC staff will continue updating of the RRAC web page.
- The ARC will prepare and submit narrative and financial status.

#### **Task 2 – AOC Habitat Project Descriptions**

- The ARC, with the support of RRAC members, will develop more in depth project descriptions for approximately 10 of the projects on the Habitat Restoration Project List. The project descriptions will include updated background, photos, maps, amount of habitat to be restored (Ex: linear feet of shoreline or stream, acres of wetland, etc.), and preliminary cost estimate. The project list will be used by EPA and MDEQ in order to plan funding priorities for the AOC and for seeking future grants and local match.
- ARC and RRAC will communicate as needed with MDEQ and EPA regarding the projects on the list.

#### Task 3 – Fish Sampling

This task will include surveying of 20 sites on the Main and Upper Rouge and compile and map all FOTR fish data collected over the past four years. Fish surveys will be conducted using seine nets by FOTR to sample all available habitats and volunteers will be trained to assist in holding nets, chasing fish into nets and collecting fish. All fish will be identified, measured and released. A QAPP will be developed for approval by the MDEQ. It is anticipated that with the data collected currently and a review of past data delisting recommendations for portions of the Rouge no longer impaired for fish may be able to be made.

This project will address the *Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Action Plan* focus areas in the following ways:

- *Habitat and Wildlife Protection and Restoration:* The project will advance Fish and Wildlife Habitat by having projects ready for funding as grant opportunities arise.
- Near Shore Health and Non-point Source Pollution: Many of the projects have dual benefits that provide habitat while reducing stream flashiness and nonpoint source pollutant loads.
- Accountability, Monitoring, Evaluation, Communication, and Partnerships: The process of developing the more in-depth project descriptions will encourage a dynamic partnership between EPA, MDEQ, MDNR, RRAC, and ARC who provide a good representation of stakeholders, the public and agencies that can restore the AOC.

#### 5. Project Outcomes and Deliverables

The anticipated outcomes/deliverables for this project are:

- Improved understanding by the EPA, MDEQ, RRAC and ARC of the habitat impairments in the watershed and opportunities for restoration.
- More robust RRAC membership participation.
- Additional opportunities for grant funding
- RRAC meeting summaries and agendas.
- Up-to-date website.
- Habitat Restoration Project List project descriptions.
- Fish survey data and reporting.
